Garbage

- Garbage is collected weekly. Each household is allowed one free garbage bag per collection. Place your garbage at the curb before 7:00 a.m.
- Garbage bags must be less than 50 lbs each (including weight of the garbage can).
- Each extra garbage bag must have an easily seen holographic garbage tag. These tags can be purchased from one of our retailers and never expire.
- Do not mix recyclable material into your garbage.
- When there is a statutory holiday, your collection may be delayed by one day. See the calendar for details.
- If you are a tenant in a multi-unit property, please ask your landlord for your garbage tags.

Recycling (Alternating Collection)

- Recycling is collected weekly. It alternates every week between a grey bin and a blue bin, and is collected on the same day as your garbage.
- There is no limit to the amount of recycling you can set out. Do not put your items in a bag (clear, blue, etc.).
- Place your recycling at the curb before 7:00 a.m.

Grey bin is for fibers only. This includes newspapers, flyers, magazines, catalogues, brown bags, cardboard, envelopes, books, and egg cartons. Remember to discard plastic bags and liners.

Blue bin is for plastic, metal and glass only. This includes plastic bottles & containers with #1, #2, #4, #5, #7 (no plastic bags), glass jars & bottles, metal food and beverage cans, clean aluminum plates and trays (no aluminum foil, pots or scrap metal).

Plastic, Metal, and Glass Recycling

Plastic

- Plastic bottles and containers with the # 1, 2, 4, 5 and 7
- Please remove metal handles



Metal

- Food and beverage cans
- Steel food cans
- Empty paint and aerosol cans (must be empty, dry, lids removed)
- Clean aluminum plates and trays



Glass

- Clean jars and bottles

Non-Recyclable Items

Plastic bags, straws, stir sticks, blister or bubble packs, toys, chairs or stretch wrap (for example, Saran Wrap), plastic with identification number 3 or 6, aluminum foil or pots or scrap metal, window glass, or ceramics.



Cardboard and Paper Recycling

Cardboard

- Envelopes, office paper
- Newspapers, flyers, magazines, catalogues, phone books, books
- Egg cartons, coffee trays
- Brown paper bags
- Cereal, tissue, detergent boxes, etc.
- Cardboard milk and juice cartons
- Shredded paper (in a box)

Remember to discard plastic liners.

Non-Recyclable Items

Single juice boxes, soiled newspaper, tissue paper, paper towels, wax-coated boxes, soiled pizza boxes or laminated paper.



Leaf and Yard Waste

- Collection will take place on your usual weekly collection day.
- The curbside leaf and yard waste collection is free.
- Leaf and yard waste must be packaged in paper bags or in reusable containers and placed by the curbside by 7:00 a.m.
- Plastic bags are not accepted (except biodegradable bags).
- Bundle and tie branches; branches should not be longer than 4 feet, 2 inches in diameter.
- Halloween pumpkins are accepted.

Don't wait until collection day. Bring your leaf and yard waste to the GFL Transfer Station for free any time of the year at 211 Corduroy Road, Vars.

- Wooden popsicle sticks
- Untreated woodchips & sawdust

Organic Waste – Unacceptable Material List

- Animal fur and feathers
- Animals
- Ashes

Large Item Collection

1 item only per residence

- Maximum weight limit of 100 lbs, except fridges and freezers
- Put your item at the curb for 7:00 a.m. on the Monday of the collection week, regardless of your regular collection day.
- Items with refrigerant gas (freon) must be emptied and tagged by a certified technician. Restrictions apply.

Curbside Exchange Day
